- Live into the foundational hope we are given in the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus, as you explore the stories of his ministry on earth

- Live into the fullness of love for God and neighbor as you "do less" of the ordinary stuff in your life to make room for this special season.

HOW IT WORKS

While this resource offers daily practices, feel free to make it your own as a family. You can do it daily, every other day, or set aside a section of time once a week. Download it to your phone, tablet, or laptop and keep it with you to use as it works best for your family. Parents and older children in the family can lead younger children. Be sure to add your own prayers to each day. Read over *What You Will Need* so you will have what you need wherever and whenever you spend this time together. Because of the diversity in ages, this resource does not explore the death of Jesus. We encourage families to use the storybook and your church worship and discipleship opportunities to read, pray, and reflect together in a way that is appropriate for the children in your family.

HOW ZOE HELPS

In our world, children are struggling alone in poverty because one or both parents are sick or have died of HIV/AIDS, disease, war, famine, and other causes. Zoe brings these children together into supportive groups and connects them to local resources, training and churches that empower them so that they can take care of themselves and their families after three years in the Zoe empowerment program.

- 1. Helping Children Be Connected: When children first start the empowerment program, Zoe Empowers brings them together into a Working Group of 60-100 fellow orphans from their community. This group becomes like a new family, able to help one another in many ways. Zoe Empowers connects children to their community leaders, and helps them connect to God in their local church. Zoe social workers assist children in reuniting with relatives and siblings who may have left home.
- 2. Helping Children Be Healthy: Zoe social workers teach children about ways to stay healthy, including boiling water before drinking, washing hands and dishes, and proper nutrition for a balanced diet. Zoe Empowers provides children with mosquito nets and blankets to keep them safe from insect-borne diseases. Children learn about the causes and prevention of diseases such as HIV/AIDS, and how to care for those who are infected.
- 3. Helping Children Be Prepared: When children graduate after three years in the Zoe program, they are prepared to care for themselves and their younger siblings. They have secure, dependable sources of food and income. Through Zoe Empowers, children have access to micro-grants, vocational training, and business start-up materials. Working Groups will frequently reach out to assist other orphans in their villages.
- **4. Helping Children Be Secure:** Zoe social workers ensure children have a safe place to live, know about their rights, and are free from abuse and exploitation. Children learn skills such as farming and animal husbandry at monthly meetings. Zoe Empowers provides them with tools, seeds and farm animals so they can grow and raise their own food. When children need a home, Zoe Empowers provides the necessary materials and their peer Working Group assists in the construction.
